

PROPOSAL B: Ejection Policies

RATIONALE

To enhance consistency in policies regarding ejections within the NJCAA framework, it is important to address the discrepancies that exist. Many officials work at both the NCAA and NJCAA levels, and the variation in policies has led to some confusion.

Non-Collegial Incidents and Derogatory Comments:

- Retain the existing language regarding Non-Collegial Incidents and Derogatory Comments, emphasizing that such behavior will not be tolerated and may lead to further disciplinary actions

Suspension Protocol:

- All individuals or players serving suspensions due to ejections must be “out-of-sight-and-sound” from the playing area during games.

Ejection Form Enhancements:

- The ejection form will now include a section for the Athletic Director to indicate the number of games associated with each ejection.
- The NJCAA will verify the accuracy of these indicated games by reviewing a standardized chart that tracks ejections across all sports.

Implementation and Communication

- Ensure that all coaches, players, and administrative staff are informed about these policies and the importance of adhering to them.
- Conduct training sessions if necessary to clarify the ejection process and the consequences of non-compliance

PROPOSED NEW LANGUAGE / ADDITION

Ejection Procedures:

- Each sport will adhere to the specific ejection/sportsmanship policies outlined in the NCAA rulebook.

Ejections during Scrimmages:

- Consequences of ejection: any ejection during a scrimmage result in the student-athlete or staff member being excluded from participating for the rest of the day and must be removed from facility.
 - Ejection Reports: Required during scrimmages.
 - Non-Collegial Incidents: Must be reported, regardless of the scrimmage setting.
